Who Are We?

Holiday4Heroes was founded in 2007 by Jonette Kessack, who owned a postage and wine store. This grassroots effort was started to fill a need to provide comfort and care to our deployed men and women all over the world. We are a group of team members, volunteers and



business owners who had a desire to show our military that we remember them and appreciate their sacrifices for us.

What Do We Do?

What started as a holiday program, our first year sending 40 packages, became a year-round effort. We now send 100 to 200 comfort packages each month to our brave men and women, and 1,000 packages for our holiday mission. We have now sent almost a total of 20,000 packages.

To fill the need at home we have added more programs for our community to serve our in-need and homeless veterans and their families.

Additions To The Mission

In 2019, we started our Backpack for Homeless and In-Need Veterans Program partnering with the VA and various homeless coalitions. Our backpacks are filled with personal care items, high protein snacks and information on where to get help.



In 2020, we began distributing bulk food drops to our in-need veterans and their families through the VA food pantry.

In 2021 our local VA Clinic asked us if we could help fill a need in our community. We were asked if we could provide tents and water filtration bottles for our veterans who are losing their homes during the current housing crisis.

In 2022 we realized that some of our Mission Make Merry Families, sometimes, need a little extra help for emergencies. When funds are available, we provide what we can to help our families get through these difficult times with a little less stress. Please read about some of the things we are doing for our families.

with the Gunterberg Foundation and Midwest Food Bank. The Brotherhood of Heroes Resource Center serves as the headquarters and meeting place for the Cape Coral Chapter of Disabled American Veterans, Korean War Vets, Military Order of the Purple Heart, the Marine League, American Merchant Marine Veterans, Destroyer Escort Sailors Association, Combat Infantrymen's Association, and the Cape Coral chapter of the Fraternal Order of Police, while enjoying partnerships with numerous community-based organizations such as United Way, Mission United 211, and the AARP.

The resource center also offers a meeting room that is not only perfect for in-person meetings but is also Zoom equipped for remote meetings. The meeting room is cleaned and disinfected after every use, and face masks and hand sanitizer are always provided by the Brotherhood of Heroes.

Cpl. George Metzger Gallery

George Washington

Greeting visitors and providing an overview of the museum is Gen. George Washington. In 1782, during the American Revolution, Gen. Washington established the Badge of Merit, a forerunner of the Purple Heart and America's first military decoration. Gen.

Washington would go on to serve as the first President of the United States from 1789 to 1797. **Purple Heart**

Established in 1932, the Purple Heart is a military decoration awarded to armed services members who were injured or killed while serving the U.S. Military. The Brotherhood of Heroes Museum is the permanent home of the Florida Purple Heart Wall, which chronicles the state's Purple Heart

recipients who have died in combat since the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks on the nation.

.50 Cal. Machine Gun

The awesome .50 Browning is a centerpiece in our museum. During World War II, virtually every U.S. and Allied combat aircraft, naval ship, armored vehicle



and infantry unit was equipped with big Brownings, known to millions of servicemen and women as the "Browning M2" or simply the "Ma Deuce."

Stalingrad

The German machine gunner on display depicts the Battle of Stalingrad, which marked a turning point in the Allied victory in Europe during World War II. From August 1942 through February 1943, more than two million troops fought in close quarters - and nearly two million people were





killed or injured in the fighting, including tens of thousands of Russian civilians.

Willys Jeep

A focal point of the museum is a 1945 Willys Jeep. It was found on a farm in Lancaster County. Pa., before being fully restored. After World War II, many Jeeps were used like tractors for farm work. In addition to being used in World War II, this Jeep was also used by Lancaster County fire department.

The mission of the Cape Coral Economic and Business Development Office (EBDO) is to achieve a balanced economy in the Cape by encouraging the creation of new businesses, expanding existing businesses, and attracting new firms from outside the area. The EBDO creates and administers financial incentives, promotes Cape Coral through advertising and public relations programs, and serves as a business ombudsman to assist with licensing, zoning, and other government-related questions in the Cape.

Tip Of The Month

What controls distance on all shots? Length and pace of stroke is the answer. You would swing a driver back to your knee and through to your knee to hit it far. And the same can be said for a 10-foot putt. You would swing that back to your shoulder and through to your shoulder.

If a hard-wired smoke alarm needs to be replaced, this is the responsibility of the homeowner, who may need to contact a licensed electrician.

Renters: According to

Florida State Statute 83.51 subsection 2, paragraph

B, "Unless otherwise agreed in writing, at the commencement of the tenancy of a single-family home or duplex, the landlord shall install working smoke detection devices." In other words, the landlord is responsible for ensuring working smoke alarms are installed in rental units before occupants move in, unless it is otherwise agreed in writing. And you should never agree to not having smoke alarms installed.

U.S. Department Of Agriculture Awards \$1 Million Grant To Cape Coral

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) selected the City of Cape Coral to receive a \$1 million grant for urban reforestation throughout Cape Coral.* The grant is part of a larger USDA project, Investing in America, which invests money to expand access to trees and green spaces in communities and neighborhoods nationwide. The USDA selected Cape Coral because the city is working to increase equitable access to trees and green spaces and their many benefits.

The City of Cape Coral will use the money to plant trees in numerous parks and green spaces across the city in all seven council districts. Cape Coral will hold workshops and volunteer tree-planting days annually to foster broad community engagement. The project will promote the cultural and social benefits of trees while reducing the effects of climate change.

Trees make a difference. Studies show that communities with access to trees and green spaces are associated with improved health outcomes, reduced crime, lower average temperatures, and an influx of other kinds of investments and new economic opportunities. Through funding from the Inflation Reduction Act, the Forest Service is making historic investments in boosting the nation's tree cover in urban, suburban and rural communities nationwide. The USDA selected 385 grant proposals and funded proposals in all 50 states, two U.S. territories, three U.S. affiliated Pacific islands and several tribal communities.

*The grant funding will be up for approval by City Council at a future City Council meeting.

The IRS mails letters or notices to taxpayers for a variety of reasons including if:

- They have a balance due.
- They are due a larger or smaller refund.
- The agency has a question about their tax return.
- They need to verify their identity.
- The agency needs additional information.
- The agency changed their tax return.


• Do inform your tax advisor immediately.

• Don't ignore it. Most IRS letters and notices are about federal tax returns or tax accounts. The notice or letter will explain the reason for the contact and will give instructions on what to do.

• Don't panic. The IRS and its authorized private collection agencies generally contact taxpayers by mail. Most of the time, all the taxpayer needs to do is read the letter carefully and take the appropriate action.

• Do read the notice. If the IRS changed the tax return, the taxpayer should compare the information provided in the notice or letter with the information in their original return. In general, there is no need to contact the IRS if the taxpayer agrees with the notice.

• Do respond timely. If the notice or letter requires a response by a specific date, taxpayers should reply in a timely manner to:

- o minimize additional interest and penalty charges.
- preserve their appeal rights if they don't agree.
- Do not call the IRS, call your tax advisor

• Do keep a copy of the notice or letter. It's important to keep a copy of all notices or letters with other tax records. Taxpayers may need these documents later.

• Do remember there is usually no need to call the IRS. If a taxpayer must contact the IRS by phone, they should use the number in the upper right-hand corner of the notice. The taxpayer should have a copy of their tax return and letter when calling. Typically, taxpayers only need to contact the agency if they don't agree with the information, if the IRS request additional information, or if the taxpayer has a balance due. Taxpayers can also write to the agency at the address on the notice or letter. If taxpayers write, they should allow at least 30 days for a response.

· Do avoid scams. The IRS will never contact a taxpayer using social media or text message. The first contact from the IRS usually comes in the mail. Taxpayers who are unsure if they owe money to the IRS can view their tax account information on IRS.gov.


