

One Year After Hurricane Ian – Farmer Joe's Thriving And Still Giving Back

When Lee Snyder opened Farmer Joe's grocery store on Pine Island Road in Cape Coral back in January of 2022, he could never have envisioned the challenges he would face before his doors were even open for one full year.

Aside from the normal issues associated with such 2022 would change their Snyder trajectory going forward for



a large endeavor, Sept. 28, Farmer Joe's owner Lee

good - forcing him and other local businesses into a different business model - with a different call.

Snyder and his team answered that call, and then some. Hurricane Ian would not hold them back.

By Sept. 29 – the day after the hurricane hit – Southwest Florida had already become one of the largest hurricane

disaster areas in the United States' history. Numerous organizations, both local and out-of-state, were gearing up for a long relief process. Farmer Joe's began that day assessing the damage and preparing to re-open. But it wouldn't work out the way they had planned.

"Thinking back, we were really set up not to go down after a big hurricane," Snyder recalled. "We had this huge generator that holds enough fuel to run for a few days and keep us open. But after our initial assessment we realized all of the roof damage had totally ruined the generator. So, we had to switch gears. After all of our employees were accounted for, we decided to offer them the opportunity to come back and receive a paycheck."

But this time his employees would be coming back to work for a different reason.

Snyder was contacted by a church organization up in South Carolina called Spokes for Hope, whose faith-based volunteers specialize in food distribution relief in disaster areas. They said they were looking for a dry facility where

Oktoberfest – Throughout The Years

The German American Social Club (GASC) of Cape Coral was founded as a nonpolitical organization in July 1964 with a charter membership



of 34. Willy Gruetzenbach, one of the prime movers in its formation, was elected to serve as president. The purpose of the club, then and now, is to promote good fellowship with a variety of social activities, to perpetuate traditional German Dances, etc., and to stimulate interest in the German language and customs. Originally, the monthly meetings were held in the side rooms of the Cape Coral Yacht Club, and the club's first few main festivals and dances were celebrated in the Cape Coral Fire Hall. As the membership grew, meetings and social events were held in the main hall of the Cape Coral Yacht Club.

In 1973, the club formulated plans to build its own clubhouse. The members contributed both financially and physically to the construction of the building. On March 17, 1974, local dignitaries participated in the groundbreaking tribute to St Patrick's Day. Four hundred people attended the ceremony. In October 1975 the "von Steuben Hall" was officially dedicated; and in July 1976, the small Edelweiss

People moved to Cape Coral from locations across the United States and even from around the world, especially Europe. One should not underestimate the importance of local clubs and community groups that sprang up in Cape Coral's first decade. They proved critical in helping people make friends and find their place in the rapidly growing Cape. Many clubs had to do with a home state, such as the Buckeye Club for Ohio natives. Others had to do with hobbies, such as the Orchid Club. One of the most well-known clubs in Cape Coral is the German-American Club. Members are seen in this photo from 1966. The club was formed by Willy Gruetzenbach to help the Cape's large German population get used to a new country and a new climate. The club is most famous now for its annual Oktoberfest celebrations that attract visitors from around the state.

they could stage their operations for sending their food trucks out to the barrier islands. In exchange for providing the staging area they would also provide Farmer Joe's with assistance to help out locally. Farmer Joe's also partnered with the Harry Chapin Food Bank – and together those two organizations – along with Farmer Joe's employees working the long car lines each day for a couple of hours, fed over 15,000 families in four weeks.

"Words really can't describe how it makes you feel when you can give back to the community at a time of need," Snyder said. "You just know deep down you're doing the right thing. And on top of that being able to keep our core employees on the payroll when no money was coming in for them was really part of the challenge. Being able to provide for both the community and our employees was special for us."

Snyder has had a long history in Southwest Florida in providing for the community.

"I grew up in Cape Coral – been here since 1978. In the mid '80s I got into the produce business with a buddy of mine, Alfie Oakes," Snyder recalls. "We'd sell produce out of the back of our pickup truck at the foot of the Edison and the Cape Coral bridges. That led into running quite a few open-air roadside markets between here and Orlando and also up in the state of Delaware – did that for about 15 years before Farmer Joe's evolved."

Snyder said the idea of Farmer Joe's was actually unexpected. He was once asked if he had the choice of building a massive 55,000-square-foot store, where would he build it. He had a few investors that showed interest, so he decided Pine Island Road was the best choice.

Supplied with his lifelong experience in the food service industry and with a clear vision for what he could provide for Cape Coral and the surrounding area, Farmer Joe's finally became a reality in January 2022 and with it a much anticipated grand opening.

"We knew going into this that we were going to be surrounded by competitors, and that their buying power would be much greater than ours," Snyder said. "So, we had to give our customers something extra – our employees had to focus on giving outstanding customer service. We also have the largest produce department in the state of Florida with over 13,000 square feet – not everyone has those bragging rights. Growing up in the produce industry all of my life, I feel like that was my forte."

In addition to a special customer focused employee base and competitive prices, Farmer Joe's is also proud to be working with many local farmers in our area.

"We're very fortunate here in Florida – our growing season is eight months long – during the offseason we can lean heavily on our farmers from the northeast, then we can rely on our local farmers for the majority of the year," Snyder explained. "Hanshaw Farms, Oakes Farms, Gargiulo Farms,

and all of our farmers out in Immokalee are just a few of the vendor names you will see in our produce area when you come in to shop."

The Farmer Joe's mission statement on their website reads ... To bring real food back to the family dinner table by partnering with farmers, championing local products, and creating an enchanting customer experience. It's a constant challenge that demands a laser focused effort each day.

"The community has totally embraced our store," Snyder proudly states. "We've tried to create the whole atmosphere here, where you can feel the positive energy once you walk through our doors. We'll continue to work closely with the Harry Chapin Food Bank on local food drives, offer our customers the finest service in the food industry, and offer weekly specials that will help in making your shopping experience with us a special one."

become a major event recognized by the City of Cape Coral, business leaders and organizations, as well as the entire community. The club had celebrated Oktoberfest on a small scale in the past, but in October 1986, local dignitaries and German Consul from Atlanta and Miami participated in the opening ceremonies of the three-day outdoor Oktoberfest on the club grounds, with approximately 10,000 people attending the initial three-day festival. A 30-piece band from Waltenhausen, Germany was featured among others. In 1991 the annual Oktoberfest was expanded to six days – two consecutive weekends.

Munich in Cape Coral is now being prepared for the 38th time. The Cape Coral Oktoberfest has since become the largest party of the year in the community! It is the event for fun, good food, freshly poured domestic and German beer, live music on several stages, laughter, dancing – from Polka to Fliegerlied to the Chicken Dance – with or without the chicken hat – simply put, it represents that famous German Gemütlichkeit.

Capitalizing on Inflation Reduction Act funding and following a top-to-bottom review of enforcement efforts, the Internal Revenue Service announced today the start of a sweeping, historic effort to restore fairness in tax compliance by shifting more attention onto high-income earners, partnerships, large corporations and promoters abusing the nation's tax laws.

The effort, building off work following last August's IRA funding, will center on adding more attention on wealthy, partnerships and other high earners that have seen sharp drops in audit rates for these taxpayer segments during the

The changes will be driven with the help of improved technology as well as artificial intelligence that will help IRS compliance teams better detect tax cheating, identify emerging compliance threats and improve case selection tools to avoid burdening taxpayers with needless "no-change" audits.

As part of the effort, the IRS will also ensure audit rates do not increase for those earning less than \$400,000 a year as well as adding new fairness safeguards for those claiming the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). The EITC was designed to help workers with modest incomes. Audit rates of those receiving the EITC remain at high levels in recent years while rates dropped precipitously for those with higher income, partnerships and others with more complex tax situations. The IRS will also be working to ensure unscrupulous tax preparers do not exploit people claiming these important tax credits. **More Scrutiny On FBAR Violations**

High-income taxpayers from all segments continue to utilize foreign bank accounts to avoid disclosure and related taxes. A U.S. person with a financial interest over a foreign financial account is required to file a Report of Foreign Bank and Financial Accounts (FBAR) if the aggregate value of all foreign financial accounts is more than \$10,000 at any time. IRS analysis of multiyear filing patterns has identified hundreds of possible FBAR nonfilers with account balances that average over \$1.4 million. The IRS plans to audit the most egregious potential nonfiler FBAR cases in Fiscal Year 2024. **Helping Working Taxpayers Through Improving Compliance Selections; Protecting Taxpayers And Businesses From Aggressive Scams And Schemes**

In addition to expanding compliance attention on high-

income, partnerships and others, the IRS will be focused on ensuring audit fairness and protecting all taxpayers from a variety of scams and schemes. While IRS compliance work will be increasing on the wealthy, scammers and fraudsters frequently target average taxpayers with more modest incomes, so the IRS will be focused on raising consumer awareness on these issues.

"The IRS is on the side of taxpayers, and we will be working to protect hardworking people from scammers or fraudsters who try to use the tax system for their schemes, whether it's promising people inflated EITC amounts or tricking people into tax-related identity theft," said IRS Commissioner Danny Werfel. "Protecting hardworking taxpayers is a critical component to ensuring the success of the nation's tax system, and the IRS will be working throughout the fall and into the 2024 filing season to take steps to help people."

Protection Against Identity Theft

The IRS will continue the groundbreaking efforts of the Security Summit initiative, a joint effort between the federal government, state tax agencies and the nation's software and tax professional communities. Since 2015, the private-public sector coalition has worked together to build internal defenses and share information to protect against identity thieves trying to steal tax refunds. A key part of the Security Summit initiative has been focused on raising taxpayer and tax professional awareness on how to protect themselves and their tax data from identity theft. This groundbreaking effort will continue this fall with National Tax Security Awareness Week.





Remember When ... Route 66 Was Filmed In Cape Coral?

A large part of the marketing hype for the nascent city was to bring in Hollywood celebrities, and in 1963, two episodes of the popular TV series, Route 66, was filmed at the Nautilus.

Martin Milner and Glenn Corbett starred, with a bit part in the first episode - Who Will Cheer My Bonnie Bride? (Season 3, Episode 29) - along with another unknown actor named Gene Hackman. This episode aired on May 10, 1963, with the storyline of: Tod (Martin

Milner) and Linc's (Glenn Corbett) car breaks down. Linc hitches a ride with Alva and Charlie, two robbers who force him to drive their getaway car.

Another lesser-known episode aired on May 17, 1963, was Shadows Of An Afternoon, (Season 3, Episode 30) where Tod and Linc are working in a Florida town when Linc is accused of stabbing an unfriendly dog and is arrested.

And the last episode that was filmed in Cape Coral was Two Strangers And An Old Enemy (Season 4, Episode 1) where the storyline is: While in a Florida swamp, Tod and Linc meet Major Barden, an American World War II ace and Takasuka, a Japanese officer who are still fighting the war. That episode aired on Sept. 27, 1963.

You can stream these episodes for free on FreeVee, Tubi or Roku or purchase the episodes through Google Play or Amazon for a small charge.

The Role Of Oxygen

Oxygen is essential for life. This element, which makes up about 21% of the earth's atmosphere at sea level, is key to our health because our bodies need it in order to function on a cellular level. We can go without food for almost forty days, and we can last about four days without water. However, we can only survive for approximately four minutes without oxygen. If the brain is deprived of oxygen for longer than that, it's a recipe for severe neurological damage and even death. Our cells need oxygen in order to make ATP, which is essentially the "energy" on which our bodies run. If there isn't adequate energy, then the neurons (the cells responsible for receiving sensory input from the outside world and for sending motor commands to our muscles) fail and many forms of neurological dysfunction and chronic health problems may follow.

The nervous system is made up of individual cells called neurons, and to maintain the health of these neurons, oxygen is crucial. Healthy neurons and an optimally functioning nervous system are essential building blocks for structural integrity of the cells, fighting chronic health issues and healing the body.

Let's take a moment to dive deeper into understanding neurons and their function in our bodies.

A neuron's job is to transmit communication from the brain to the body and from the body back to the brain. Neurons communicate in two ways: electronically (similar to the electrical system in your home) and chemically (called neurotransmitters). In order for neurons to optimize communication between the brain and the body (and vice versa), they need three things: oxygen, glucose, and stimulation. If any of one of those three elements are taken away, you get neurons that don't "fire" properly, and malfunctioning neurons may cause brain fog, attention, memory issues as well as numbness, tingling and pins and needles sensation in the body.

If these neurons are interfered with, stunted, blunted or damaged in any way, the stage is set for an environment of dysfunction, which then may lead to a disease process.

• Monitor the weather.

• Know how long it will take to gather everyone and get them inside to a safe, enclosed structure.

• Seek shelter even before it starts raining. Go inside when the thunder starts to roar.

• Don't resume activities until 30 minutes after the last strike of lightning is seen and the last sound of thunder is heard.

• Use the 30-second rule: Count the seconds between seeing the lighting and hearing the thunder. Seek shelter if it's less than 30 seconds.

• Remember lightning safety year-round and stay in practice.

If you find yourself caught in the open and unable to seek out shelter in time, seek lower ground if you are in an elevated area. Never lie flat on the ground but instead crouch down in a ball-like position with your head tucked and hands over your ears. Stay away from objects like power lines and barbed wire fences. Don't shelter under a tree and get out of and away from ponds, lakes and other bodies of water.
