


# Oktoberfest – Throughout The Years

The German American Social Club (GASC) of Cape Coral was founded as a nonpolitical organization in July 1964 with a charter membership of 34. Willy Gruetzenbach, one of the prime movers in its formation, was elected to serve as president. The purpose of the club, then and now, is to promote good fellowship with a variety of social activities, to perpetuate traditional German festivals such as Oktoberfest, Karneval, Costume Balls, Folk Dances, etc., and to






German language and customs. Originally, the monthly meetings were held in the side rooms of the Cape Coral Yacht Club, and the club's first few main festivals and dances were celebrated in the Cape Coral Fire Hall. As the membership grew, meetings and social events were held in the main hall of the Cape Coral Yacht Club.

In 1973, the club formulated plans to build its own clubhouse. The members contributed both financially and physically to the construction of the building. On March 17, 1974, local dignitaries participated in the groundbreaking for the new clubhouse, using green painted shovels in tribute to St Patrick's Day. Four hundred people attended the ceremony. In October 1975 the "von Steuben Hall" was officially dedicated; and in July 1976, the small Edelweiss Hall was designated for the exclusive use of club members and their guests.

Klaus Kohl, an intuitive member, was the leading influence in initiating and supervising the community's three-day Oktoberfest that has become a major event recognized by the City of Cape Coral, business

### See You Later, Alligator – Biking Through Shark Valley In The Florida Everglades

If you want to see alligators up close, then a day biking through Shark Valley in the Everglades of Florida should be on your bucket list. Located off the Tamiami Trail, the entrance to Everglades National Park is an hour and a half southeast of Naples and directly 1.5 hours west of Miami. This national park is both eerie and impressive with plenty of opportunities to see a variety of wildlife in their natural environment. Places that feel truly wild are few and far between in the United States, especially Florida – but this trail will not disappoint if you are seeking an authentic view of nature.

Create your own one-of-a-kind Everglades ecotour by taking a self-guided bike ride through this unique area of Florida. Shark Valley is a 15-mile paved trail that is ideal for any bicycle, and since the road is flat and free of rough terrain just about anyone can make the ride. A typical ride takes between two and three hours. Plan to take many stops because there's just so much to see, especially all the alligators! I had every intention to count how many alligators I saw but after 30 minutes I gave up as the gators were literally everywhere -- sunning on the side of the trail, lurking in the water and even crossing the road in front of you!

#### You Will See Alligators, Not Sharks!

You may be wondering about the name: Shark Valley, since it is full of alligators. Although sharks are one form of wildlife that you will not see in the shallow waters of the Everglades within Shark Valley, they're not too far away. Two of the estuaries supplied by the Everglades River are the Shark River and Little Shark River whose brackish waters provide wonderful feeding and nursing habitats for several species of sharks, including bull sharks, which are the top of the food chain, as well as blacktip sharks and lemon sharks.

You won't see any mountains framing the Shark Valley, but this area of Florida is in a valley because the coastal ridges of south Florida are higher than the interior part of the state. The western coastal ridge is approximately 14 to 17 feet above sea level. The Atlantic ridge is 15 to 20 feet above sea level, and the

Shark Valley Visitor Center area is about 7 feet above sea level, which puts this park in a valley between those two ridges. And that's why it is called Shark Valley, states Shark Valley Tram Tours

The word "alligator" comes from the Spanish word "el lagarto," which means "the lizard." Alligators are the largest creatures living in the Everglades. Males can reach 14 feet in length and they can weigh 1,000 pounds. Alligators are social creatures and often stay in groups called congregations. You will see this while on your bike ride through Shark Valley. These groups are typically seen basking in the sun or taking a swim. This is because alligators can't control their temperature internally. So, when they are cold, they sunbathe, and when they are hot, they go for a swim. Their appearance says, "Stay away," and that's certainly the best advice though your curiosity may be like mine and you push your limits just a little. Though many people are afraid of alligators, these animals typically keep to themselves and usually don't attack humans unless they feel threatened.

#### Skip The Bike, Take The Tram

Though I think that biking the trail is the best way to experience Shark Valley within Everglades National Park, you can see it by walking or taking the Shark Valley Tram Tour. You will learn quite a bit from the tram operator on the way out to the tower, but you will not get a chance to stop and explore the areas you are driving by.

#### Things To Know Before You Go To Shark Valley

 Under Florida law, any bicyclist under age 16 must wear a helmet.

- Admission to Everglades National Park varies depending on if you enter by car or bike or on foot. Check the website for the most current prices.
- Parking is limited, so if there's a wait to enter the park, you can choose to park on the Tamiami Trail and pedal (or walk) in.
- Hours of operation, open every day

Visitor Center: 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

leaders and organizations, as well as the entire community. The club had celebrated Oktoberfest on a small scale in the past, but in October 1986, local dignitaries and German Consul from Atlanta and Miami participated in the opening ceremonies of the three-day outdoor Oktoberfest on the club grounds, with approximately 10,000 people attending the initial three-day festival. A 30-piece band from Waltenhausen, Germany was featured among others. In 1991 the annual Oktoberfest was expanded to six days two consecutive weekends.

Munich in Cape Coral is now being prepared for the 37th time. The Cape Coral Oktoberfest has since become the largest party of the year in the community! It is **the** event for fun, good food, freshly poured domestic and German beer, live music on several stages, laughter, dancing - from Polka to Fliegerlied to the Chicken Dance – with or without the chicken hat - simply put, it represents that famous German Gemütlichkeit.

Everyone, every

generation, is encouraged to come and celebrate with their clan or crew. With German music and local bands, German food, and beer, there's plenty of fun to go around, for any age. So, dust off your dirndls, launder your lederhosen and join the club for an epic time of stein slurping with beste Freunde, even those you just met.

This year's dates are Oct. 21, 22 and 23 and 28, 29, 30 the last two full weekends of the month. 
# **Dedicated Artists Of Southwest** Florida (DASF) On Exhibit At Cape Coral Library Now Through Oct. 27


An exceptional array of two- and three-dimensional work by members of The Dedicated Artists of Southwest Florida Inc. (DASF) fill the gallery walls and display cases of the Cape Coral Library and will be in place through Oct. 27. This marks the sixth time that the local club of artists will be featured at the library located at 921 S.W. 39th Terrace, off Mohawk Parkway. The Friends of the Cape Coral Library art gallery committee is excited to have these skillful artists exhibit again this fall, because the variety of their designs and surfaces on which they paint is extensive. And that's no doubt why the club's exhibits

of members' current artwork are always eagerly anticipated by library patrons and visitors.

The Dedicated Artists of Southwest Florida is a local club of approximately 60 members who are full- or part-time residents of various cities within the local tri-county area. 

# To Cork Or Not To Cork, That Is The Question!

There are a lot of opinions about what is the best way to seal or top a bottle of wine. Some ways can be traditional or use new technology, including natural and technical cork, synthetic cork, glass and a metal screw cap. We are going to take a look at the benefits and detriments of each.

The most traditional of these is, of course, the natural cork. Believe it or not, natural corks have been used to seal wine bottles for only about 250 years, before that rags and wooden plugs were used. Cork comes from the Quercus suber, or cork oak tree. It is grown in many places in the eastern part of the world, but Portugal and Spain produce the most. It's from the bark of the tree and is harvested about every seven years, with the average lifespan of a tree being 175-plus years! Cork is a natural renewable product and no two are the same. Natural cork is best used to age wines further in the bottle because it is porous and allows tiny amounts of oxygen to enter

into the wine. Over time this breaks down the sulfites and softens the tannins. The only drawback of natural cork is that it may taint the wine, otherwise known as being "corked." This gives the wine a wet cardboard or moldy smell and comes from a natural chemical reaction to the cork. Only 1 percent of bottles may become corked. With this type of closure, you'll need to store the bottles lying down, so the corks don't dry out, resulting in breaking off in the bottle when opening. If this happens, there may be pieces of cork in your wine and you will need to filter them out.

Technical cork uses only pieces of cork pressed and glued to form a cylinder, then disks of natural cork are glued to each end. Technical corks are not good for aging wines long-term and are better for wines that are to be consumed within two years.

So, if you enjoy the experience of opening a bottle of wine with a corkscrew (aka wine key or waiter key), synthetic corks still give you that and are more economical to use for the bottler. They are made from the same material as plastic pipes, polyethylene. Synthetic corks save the wine from being corked, and may let in a little more oxygen than natural cork. One good thing is that plastic can be manufactured to offer different ranges of oxidation rate.

Screw tops have been known to be used on cheap wines. I say don't judge as I have seen screw tops on high-end wines too, and it depends on the type of liner used that controls the amount of oxygen that gets into the bottle. So, if you prefer an easy and quick way to open a bottle, and to be able to reseal it easily, then the screw top is for you!

Bottle shapes, labeling and the way they are sealed are becoming more of a marketing strategy, as many consumers buy what looks interesting or unique. You may see some wines sealed with a glass stopper. The glass bottle and the glass stopper are hermetic, allowing no oxygen to pass through. I've seen glass stoppers on rosé wines, which are best drunk young to enjoy their fruity aromas. They tend to turn to a gold copper color and lose their fruity notes, becoming spicier when exposed to oxygen over time.

Do you know how many turns it takes to twist off and remove the cage on sparkling wine? It is **always** six turns, no matter if it is champagne, cava, or prosecco! Try it!

To cork or not to cork depends on when you plan on opening and enjoying your wine.



### **Know The Signs Of Identity** Theft

The IRS reminds taxpavers that criminals still use the COVID-19 pandemic to steal people's money and identity with phishing emails, social media posts, phone calls, and text messages. All these efforts can lead to sensitive personal information being stolen, and scammers using this to try filing a fraudulent




tax return as well as harming victims in other ways. Some of the scams people should continue to be on the lookout for include Economic Impact Payment and tax refund scams, unemployment fraud leading to inaccurate taxpayer 1099-Gs, fake employment offers on social media, and fake charities that steal taxpayers' money.

Tax-related identity theft occurs when someone uses your stolen personal information, including your Social Security number, to file a tax return claiming a fraudulent refund.

Be alert to possible tax-related identity theft if:

• You get a letter from the IRS inquiring about a suspicious tax return that you did not file.

• You can't e-file your tax return because of a duplicate Social Security number.

- You get a tax transcript in the mail that you did not request.
- You get an IRS notice that an online account has been created in your name.
- You get an IRS notice that your existing online account has been accessed or disabled when you took no action.
- You get an IRS notice that you owe additional tax or refund offset.
- IRS records indicate you received wages or other income from an employer you didn't work for.
- If you e-file your tax return and get a message telling you that a dependent on your return has been claimed on another tax return or their own.

If your Social Security number is compromised and you know or suspect you are a victim of tax-related identity

theft, the IRS recommends these actions:

- Respond immediately to any IRS notice: Call the number provided.
  - Complete IRS form 14039 for Identity Theft.
- Visit IdentityTheft.gov for steps you should take right away to protect yourself and your financial accounts.
- Continue to pay your taxes and file your tax return, even if you must file a paper return.
- All taxpayers are eligible for an Identity Protection (IP) PIN. The IP PIN is a 6-digit PIN that offers additional protections for your Social Security number.

# 'No Soliciting' **Door Hangers**

#### Available At City Hall And **Police Station**

The City of Cape Coral and the Cape Coral Police Department are offering complimentary "Stop! No Soliciting" door hangers. The signs were created in response to residents who have reached out to the city and police



department with concerns regarding unwelcome solicitors coming to their homes. The bright yellow door hangers can be recognized from the street and let solicitors know which houses to skip. Residents can obtain a free door hanger by visiting the City Hall Information Desk or the Cape Coral Police Department's Information Desk.

Chapter 13 of Cape Coral's Code of Ordinances specifies the following:

- Solicitors are required to be permitted by the city.
- Solicitors cannot solicit from 5 p.m. to 9 a.m. the following morning or any time on Sunday (except by appointment or invitation of the prospective customer).
  - Solicitors must leave the property if requested.
- Solicitors must obey any "No Soliciting" signs placed

If a solicitor disregards a "No Soliciting" sign, refuses to leave the property, and/or solicits after hours, they can be reported to the police department's nonemergency number, (239) 574-3223. For emergencies or suspicious activity, call 911. To verify a solicitor's permit, call City Hall at 311.
